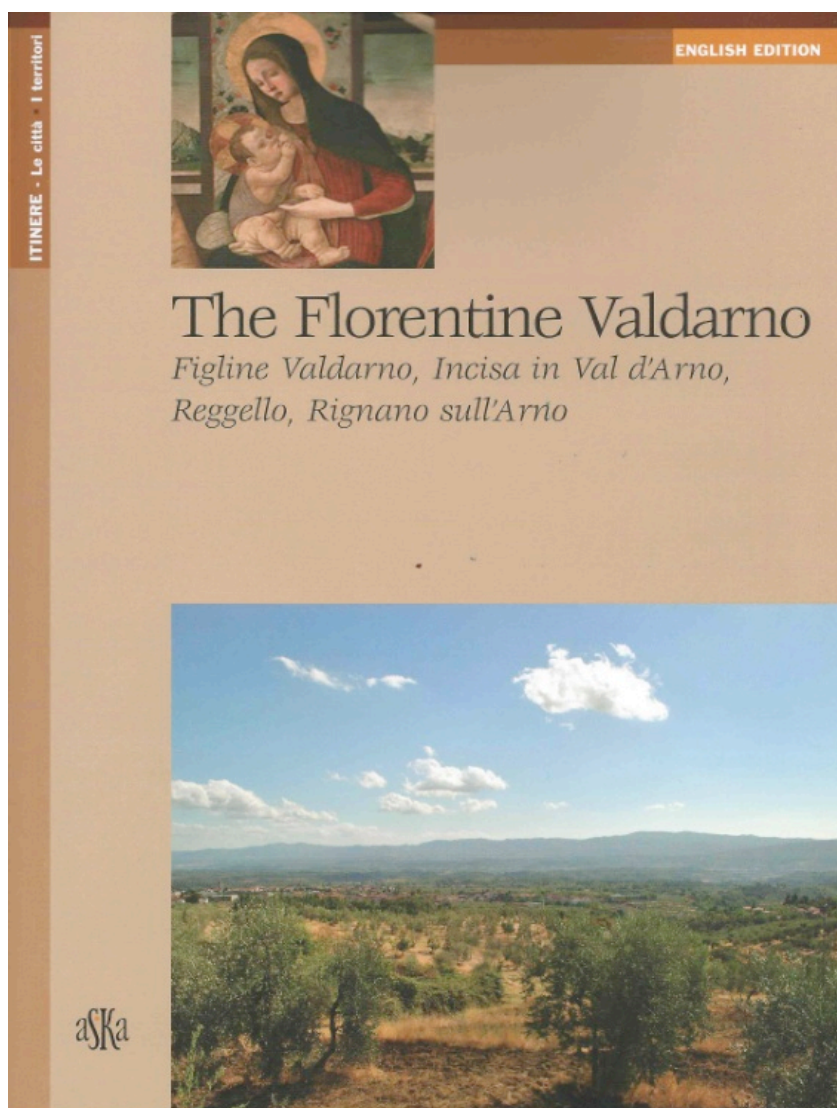

The triangle formed by the cities of Florence, Arezzo and Siena includes the valley that takes its name from the river which travels it: the Upper Valdarno. Geographically

delimited to the east by the elevations of Pratomagno and to the west by the Chianti mountains, the territory consists of fourteen municipalities, divided up from an administrative point of view between the provinces of Florence and Arezzo. Four of these are under the jurisdiction of Florence: **Figline Valdarno**, **Incisa in Val d'Arno**, **Rignano sull'Arno**, and **Reggello**. Their common designation is the Upper Florentine Valdarno.

The territory is prevalently hilly, abounding in wooded zones and high elevations, and is particularly attractive for persons wishing to become acquainted not only with Florentine history and culture,

but also with nature in its most heterogeneous aspects. Far away from "eat and run" mass tourism, small and precious, at times hidden, art treasures are waiting to be discovered and admired in total peace and quiet. It is easy to arrive in the Upper Florentine Valdarno, thanks to the A1 "Del Sole" motorway (Incisa-Reggello exit), State Road 69, and the numerous provincial roads that cross it. Alternatively, there are the trains that travel between Rome and Florence.
